DARRELL MOGILLES RECEIVES CORRIS BOYD LEADERSHIP AND DIVERSITY AWARD

WASHINGTON, D.C. – Darrell Mogilles, Assistant Vice President with HealthTrust Purchasing Group (Brentwood, TN), today received the Federation of American Hospitals’ fourth annual Corris Boyd Leadership and Diversity Award.

Mr. Mogilles was recognized for his leadership of his company’s business diversity program and his work in creating lasting partnerships between minority-owned businesses and other vendor companies.

“His outstanding leadership, knowledge, experience, energy, wisdom and integrity have been instrumental in promoting awareness, changing behaviors and empowering others to join the ongoing effort to address diversity in healthcare,” remarked Jim Eldridge, Chairman of the Federation’s Exposition Advisory Committee and Director of Pharmacy Utilization and Operations with HCA Supply Chain Services.

The award is named after the late Corris Boyd and honors his vision of building a better way to work and live through leadership and diversity. Before his untimely death in 2005, Mr. Boyd was Vice President for supply chain optimization at the former Triad Hospitals, Inc. He also served as Executive Vice President for the Health Trust Purchasing Group and was a former Chairman of the FAH’s Exposition Advisory Board.

HealthTrust Purchasing Group is a healthcare group purchasing organization. Its membership supports nearly 1,400 not-for-profit and for-profit acute care facilities, as well as ambulatory surgery centers, physician practices, and alternate care sites.
